A Special Issue on the last two rounds of calls for proposals in FP7

As you might know, most **EU Framework 7 work programmes with many different funding opportunities** will be published in July. We hope that you have saved the date for our EU FP 7 information day 24th May that will reveal some of the content in the work programmes and for our popular FP7 proposal writing course with Sean McCarthy May 6th (register here https://registrer.app.uib.no/framework7).

But how do topics get into work programs and what role could you play in all this?

The Brussels Connection, Erik Sandquist



What: Research Adviser at RCNs (NFRs) Brussels office

Who: Erik Sandquist. Erik has an education from the UiB Faculties of Social Sciences and Humanities. From 2006 he worked first as a contact person for international students and then mainly as a research adviser at the Department of Clinical Dentistry.

When: Erik started his work in Brussels in 2009 and will most likely return by the end of this year

What are your tasks? Currently I spend most of my days as part of the secretariat developing the Joint

Programming Initiative "Healthy and Productive Seas and Oceans" (www.jpi-oceans.eu) that has been proposed by Norway, Spain and Belgium. The secretariat facilitates the development of a vision document, terms of Reference and a mapping of marine and maritime research spending in the member states that will form a baseline for the Management Board. Before I got involved with the JPI I mainly followed the EU policies in the fields of researcher mobility as well the developments linked to ERC. The RCN office in Brussels is also often involved in developing a program for groups visiting Brussels as well as holding presentation to groups interested in EU research programmes and policy. We also spend a lot of time participating in seminars and meetings in Brussels and writing reports back to Norway.

How can you / NFRs Brussels office help scientists at UiB? As I always do, when asked this question, I would like to point out that scientists at the University of Bergen have the EU advisers at the Division of Research Managenent on their side. They are your most important source of information and principal advice, as I see it. Together with the Norwegian National Contact Points (NCP's, more than 30 specialists at the RCN), they should be your key administrative partners when monitoring, preparing and implementing participation in FP7. My main assistance would be to advice on relevant EU policy developments, like the current Europe 2020 strategy, and how a proposal should show impact on this policy to succeed in the evaluation as well as to understand where funding will be available in future calls. In my own newsletter, currently in Norwegian, I have tried to focus on this more policy oriented approach. The RCN office also helps out with finding contacts in the European institutions as well as providing meeting rooms and office space for Norwegian participants and applicants in FP7.

Do you have any useful tips or hints for scientists who would like to communicate with Brussels? I think the most important thing you can do when communicating with





Brussels is to think European challenges when addressing representatives of the EU institutions. How can your knowledge, networks and experience help them solve the Grand Challenges they have been asked by the European Council and Parliament to address? My impression is that Commission people are always interested in discussing with scientists. Working as an evaluator will also give you access to the Commission staff. Remember also that the Commission representatives are present at conferences, so look for them outside of Brussels as well

2013 will be the last year of the 7th framework program. Many people in Brussels and elsewhere in Europe are already busy planning the last work programmes. If you would like to try and position **your topic in one of the 10 thematic areas**, please send us your suggestions on the form you find <u>here</u> by April 27th. **Please note**: All EU work programs contain overarching themes/headings that your topic must refer to. Please contact the advisers, if you need guidance. We will forward your suggestions to the relevant National Contact Points.

The cooperation program consists of these thematic areas: Health / Food, agriculture and fisheries, and biotechnology / Information and communication technologies / Nanosciences, nanotechnologies, materials and new production technologies / Energy/ Environment (including climate change) / Transport (including aeronautics) / Socio-economic sciences and the humanities/ Space / Security



New Gateway to Research Funding programs around the world

Do you have research partners in Australia, Brasil, China, India, Canada, New Zealand, Mexico, Russia, South-Africa, South Korea or the US? Then have a look at a new database of funding opportunities that eleven so-called AccessFor EU projects have created. Search for countries or research topics. Link to database.





Two possible new ERC schemes

- 1) Proof of Concept (PoC) is a new funding instrument for ERC grantees who would like to put a research idea nearer to the market. The PoC project must be related to the ERC grant, but does not have to be the same as the ERC grant. The outcome of the PoC grant is expected to be a 'package' that can be presented to venture capitalists, or some work towards this. The PoC proposal must be led by the Principal Investigator (PI) of an ERC grant. They must have at least some involvement in the PoC project, although the bulk of the work in the PoC project can be carried out by other people. The first call came in March 2011 with cut-off dates in June and November 2011. Link to call.
- 2) ERC+ (a call will most likely be published in October 2011) is a multi-PI consortium of 2-4 excellent PIs with their groups focussing on new ideas and new approaches at the interface of disciplines. Each consortium can apply for max 15 Million € for six years

Learn more about the European Technology Platforms at a comprehensive website

European Technology Platforms (ETPs) are industry-led stakeholder fora charged with defining research priorities in a broad range of technological areas. Many of them operate in the sectors Energy, ICT and food and agriculture and can be joined by researchers / research and higher education institutions. EU work programmes are sometimes strongly influenced by ETPs work priorities. You can now more easily obtain relevant information about the individual platforms or find a contact person. People ("Marie Curie") programme Individual Fellowships for experienced researchers, deadline 11.8.2011

The European Commission has published a new call for the Marie Curie Individual Fellowships. The fellowships provide funding for a research stay for one to two years at a host institution in another European country or a country outside of Europe (Third Country). Researchers with a PhD or at least four years of research experience are eligible. Funding comprises the salary of the fellow as well as a mobility allowance and a contribution to the research costs. There are calls for three different types of fellowships:

- Intra-European Fellowships (IEF): Funding of a research stay in Europe (EU-Member State or Associated Country); Link to call
- International Incoming Fellowships (IIF): Researchers of any discipline from non-European Third countries can finance their research stay in an EU Member State or Associated Country; Link to call
- International Outgoing Fellowships (IOF): Funding of a research stay in a non-European Third Country (for example USA, Japan, Australia, etc) with a one-year reintegration phase in Europe; Link to call
